

## Olympia Dumbo penthouse tops Brooklyn luxury contracts

Unit PHA at 30 Front Street last asked \$17.5M

Olympia Dumbo is back on top of Brooklyn's luxury contracts.

A penthouse unit at 30 Front Street last asking \$17.5 million was the priciest listing to go into contract in the borough last week, according to Compass' weekly report on homes asking \$2 million or more.



Fortis Property Group launched sales at the 76-unit condo in 2021, and it has since pulled in some of the most lucrative deals in Brooklyn. Between January and May last year, 18 units at Olympia Dumbo went into contract with an average asking price of \$2,458 per square foot — about \$400 more expensive than those at the previous chart-topper, the Quay Tower in Brooklyn Heights.

Olympia Dumbo's Unit PHA spans around 4,300 square feet and has four bedrooms and three bathrooms. The apartment is to feature a

Amenities at the building, which is expected to be completed later this year, will include a 24-hour doorman and concierge, bicycle storage, a fitness center and boxing gym and a two-lane bowling alley.

The second most expensive property to enter contract last week was 1201 East 23rd Street in Midwood, last asking \$3.7 million. The house, built in 1996, spans 5,300 square feet and has six bedrooms and four bathrooms.
